Major General Allan Elliott

DEPUTY CHIEF OF STAFF/ASSISTANT DEPUTY COMMANDING GENERAL, USAR

Major General Allan Elliott became the U.S. Army Materiel Command Deputy Chief of Staff and Assistant Deputy Commanding General for the U.S. Army Reserve in August 2016.

He came to AMC following a tour as Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff, G-4, Mobilization and Training (Individual Mobilization Augmentee), Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff G-4, U.S. Army.

Major General Elliott received a Regular Army commission as a second lieutenant in the Infantry from North Georgia College in 1984. He has served in a variety of command and staff assignments during his career, both on Active Duty and in the USAR.

Major General Elliott commanded mechanized and light infantry Soldiers in the 29th Infantry Regiment and in the 3rd Battalion, 14th Infantry Regiment, 10th Mountain Division.

His USAR commands include the 1081st Ordnance Detachment; 9th Battalion (Quartermaster), 108th Regiment; and the 4013th Garrison Support Unit. Major General Elliott also served as Deputy Commanding General of the USAR's 108th Training Command.

Major General Elliott's operational and staff assignments include: Rifle Company Executive Officer, 3rd Battalion, 14th Infantry Regiment, 10th Mountain Division; Operations Staff Officer, FORSCOM Operations Center; Chief, FORSCOM Fly-away Team; Chief of Plans; and Operations and Force Projection for the FORSCOM Deputy Chief of Staff, G-4. He also served as an instructor for the Department of Defense Emergency Preparedness Course and Assistant Professor of Military Science, Georgia Institute of Technology.

Major General Elliott has numerous mobilizations in the U.S. Army Reserve. From 1990 to 1991, he served as Crisis Action Team Chief in the 24th Infantry Division and Fort Stewart Emergency Operations Center in support of Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm. During Operation Iraqi Freedom, Major General Elliott was mobilized in June 2006, deploying to Iraq as part of the Multinational Security and Transition Command – Iraq, and served as the Officer-in-Charge and Senior Coalition Advisor to the Iraqi Army Combat Arms School.

In 2013, Major General Elliott was again re-called to active duty and deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, where he served as the International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) Chief of Combined Joint Logistics (CJ4).

Major General Elliott holds a bachelor's degree in business administration from North Georgia College and a master's degree in strategic studies from the U.S. Army War College. He is a graduate of the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, the Combined Arms Services Staff School, the Infantry Officer's Basic and Advance Courses, the Military Intelligence Officer's Basic Course, the Joint Operations Planning and Execution Course, the DOD Emergency Preparedness Course, the U.S. Army Battalion/Brigade Pre-Command Course, and the U.S. Army Military History Instructor's Course.
