



Mr. Niels P. Biamon Deputy G-3 for Current Operations

Mr. Niels P. Biamon, a native of Oceanside, New York, is the Deputy G-3 for Current Operations, HQ US Army Materiel Command (AMC). He graduated from the United States Military Academy, West Point, New York in 1966 with a BS in General Engineering. He also holds a MS in Operations Research Systems Analysis from the University of Southern California and an MA in National Security and Strategic Studies from the U.S. Naval War College. His military education includes the U. S. Army Infantry and Quartermaster Officer Advanced Courses, the U.S. Army Command & General Staff College and the U.S. Naval War College.



From June 1990 to 1993 Colonel Biamon served as the Assistant Chief of Staff (ACofS) G-4 (logistics) in the XVIIIth Airborne Corps conducting combat operations in Saudi Arabia and Iraq. From August 1987 to 1989 he was assigned as the ACofS G-4 and Chief of Staff for the 8th Infantry Division in Germany. He commanded the 561st Supply and Services Battalion at Fort Campbell, KY, from 1985 to 1987. From 1982 to 1985 he served as a DoD Program Manager at Headquarters, Department of the Army. From December 1975 to June 1982 he served as an Integrated Logistics Support Officer in the Army Security Agency (ASA) and Army Materiel Command and as the Commander 3rd Armored Division Materiel Management Center in Germany. From November 1974 to October 1975 he was assigned to the Joint Staff in Seoul, Korea. He served in Vietnam from 1968 to 1969 as a company commander.

In 1993, upon completion of 26 years service Mr. Biamon retired from the U. S. Army as a Colonel and commenced employment with Vector Data Systems (VDS) in Alexandria, Virginia, as a senior systems engineer. He helped the Army define split operations, integrate the Model Direct Support Unit, the Centralized Distribution Management Activity and the Corps Repair Parts Facility into the Contingency Corps. In 1994 he became the PM for all Battle Lab projects to include the Battlefield Distribution Demonstration in United States Army Europe.

In September 1994 the Secretary of the Army recalled Mr. Biamon to active duty to serve as the Special Assistant for Logistics Automation for operations in Haiti. He developed an ITV/TAV network supporting the operations using existing Automatic Identification Technology (AIT) and existing databases. In August 1995 he rejoined VDS as the PM for Battlefield Distribution. He assumed the task lead for a DoD project in which Lockheed Martin Corporation was conducting a systems analysis of twelve competing potential DoD TAV/ITV systems.

From March 1996 to August 1997 Mr. Biamon supported the U.S. Army Combined Arms Support Command and Headquarters, USAREUR ramping up the Battlefield Distribution Demonstration to support operations in Bosnia. Since August 1997, Mr. Biamon has directed the efforts on an Office of the Secretary of Defense Joint Feasibility Study and Test on Joint Theater Distribution and has been the task manager for writing a Joint Tactics, Techniques and Procedures Manual on Joint Theater Distribution.
