Army pilot program focuses on quality of life at 'austere' posts

WASHINGTON – The Army has initiated a pilot program that targets quality-of-life improvements at Fort Irwin, California; Fort Polk, Louisiana; and Fort Wainwright, Alaska, said Gen. Gus Perna, Army Materiel Command commanding general, Feb. 4. Increasing quality of life across the force remains a top priority for Army senior leaders, Perna said. AMC evaluating capabilities in Defender-Europe-20

WASHINGTON – The Army's strength lies in its capacity to project power, said Army Materiel Command's top officer, who will be evaluating AMC's ability to move and sustain more than 20,000 service members and close to 23,000 pieces of equipment during exercise Defender-Europe 20. "The training event over in Europe, and later in the Pacific, will allow us to see ourselves at all three levels: tactical, operational and strategic," said AMC Commander Gen. Gus Perna during a Defense Writers Group event Feb. 4.



Medical Logistics drills on sustainment for DEFENDER-20

RHINE ORDNANCE BARRACKS, Germany – Army Medical Materiel Agency leaders participated in a Sustainment Rehearsal of Concept Drill on Jan. 16 to prepare for the kick off of DEFENDER-Europe 20, the area's largest military exercise in 25 years. The sustainment-focused drill allowed participating units, including foreign partners, to work through the operational plan to create a shared understanding of what each unit would be doing to ensure the right people and resources will be in the right places at the right time across the European theater.

SAN ANTONIO – In his first official event representing the Installation Management Command to an external audience, Lt. Gen. Douglas Gabram, IMCOM commanding general, described actions the Army is taking to strengthen Soldier, Family and Civilian readiness. Gabram addressed a group of Army, business and civic leaders Feb. 10 at the Association of Defense Communities' "Installation Innovation Forum 2020" in San Antonio, detailing actions in four Quality of Life priority areas: housing, childcare, spouse employment and PCS moves.



Team Red River ensures completion of up-armored HMMWVs

RED RIVER ARMY DEPOT, Texas – Team Red River has once again been instrumental in keeping the Army rolling. The depot recently completed refurbishment of 1,636 up-armored High Mobility Multipurpose Wheeled Vehicles in support of the Afghanistan National Defense and Security Services. Since August 2017, the team worked diligently to complete the refurbishment of the vehicles and during peak months produced 162 vehicles a month at a rate of nine vehicles per day. The refurbishment of the HMMWVs resulted in a \$130 million cost savings.
