### Readiness, synchronization tops Month in Review

February's AMC Month in Review takes us through the paces as Army Materiel Command's Gen. ### **IMCOM Transitions to Army Materiel Command**

JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-FORT SAM HOUSTON, Texas – Installation Management Command was formally acknowledged as a major subordinate command of Army Materiel Command during an assumption of authority ceremony March 8. The transition establishes unity of command and effort on installations, improves the readiness of Soldiers and formations, and strengthens the well-being of Soldiers, civilians and families. The move, effective March 1, frees up resources for readiness and modernization efforts, and improves overall efficiency.



### Garrison Japan Soldiers don Army Materiel Command patch

CAMP ZAMA, Japan – One by one, Col. Phillip Gage, commander of U.S. Army Garrison Japan, removed the Army Installation Management Command patches on the arms of Soldiers here March 8 and replaced them with Army Materiel Command patches. Gage and USAG Japan Command Sgt. Maj. Billy Norman held a patch-changing ceremony in front of garrison headquarters to commemorate the garrison's command change to the AMC. The Soldiers have a new command: however, their mission remains the same.



### SDDC focuses on comprehensive readiness at quarterly update

SCOTT AIR FORCE BASE, Ill. – During a quarterly update meeting Feb. 25 at the Military Surface Deployment and Distribution Command, commander Maj. Gen. Stephen Farmen reported on SDDC's progress with the Army Materiel Command's internal, four-stage "Shape the Fight" workforce realignment initiative, getting the go-ahead from AMC commander Gen. Gus Perna to move forward into the next stage of realignment. Praising SDDC's progress, Perna said"our collective goal must be to have 100 percent of the people doing 100 percent of the right work."



### ANAD rebuilds powerful M88 engines

ANNISTON ARMY DEPOT, Ala. – In the depot's Powertrain Flexible Maintenance Facility, artisans overhaul, repair and rebuild diesel engines that power many of the combat vehicles in the Army's fleet. One of the largest diesel engines they work on is the AVDS-1790-8CR, a V-12 twin-turbo diesel engine for the M88A2 Hercules, which is used in rescue and recovery missions for other heavy combat vehicles. As each engine arrives, it is cleaned, drained of fluids, then disassembled to its smallest components.

### SDDC leaders get Left of Boom


