REDSTONE ARSENAL, Ala. – The future is now. Teamwork primes training devices, boosts combat readiness

TOBYHANNA ARMY DEPOT, Pa. – In the largest public-private partnership in Tobyhanna Army Depot history, the organic industrial base facility joined forces with a defense contractor to repair thousands of laser-based training devices fielded throughout the Army. Team Tobyhanna is scheduled to repair more than 90,000 pieces of man-worn and vehicular hardware that are part of the Instrumentable-Multiple Integrated Laser Engagement System family of training devices. Employees at the depot are also repairing small arms transmitters, part of the IWS.
