Logistics Data Analysis Center (LDAC) formally Logistic Support Activity (LOGSA) is highly focused on logistics execution and data management, to include decision support analysis, tools, data and acquisition support. LDAC's efforts to synchronize, integrate and conduct analysis of sustainment data provides materiel solutions to assist senior leader decision making while improving Army readiness.

To accomplish its mission, LDAC is organized into the following functionally diverse areas:

Strategic Readiness Division provides functional subject matter expertise and develops/manages requirements for design and sustainment of multi-functional business intelligence and information technology capabilities and provides a centralized activity for authoritative Material Master data management that supports effective Army Readiness worldwide.

Program Management Division enables data-driven decision-making through enterprise-level data quality and technical/programmatic management to deliver trusted data platforms, business intelligence, authoritative logistics information, and analytics decision support that optimizes the Readiness of the Army Materiel Command's Strategic Support Area and the effectiveness of the logistics domain data stewards.

To provide sustainment data, information technology and decision support to improve readiness and enable effective Army Senior Leader decision-making from the Strategic Support Area to the tactical point of need.

Life Cycle Support Division enables the transition to sustainment across all phases of product support development and execution through the standardization of product support analysis and logistics product data; acquisition and logistics software tools; and ensuring adequate logistics product support is available for systems to soon be fielded or transitioned to Army Materiel Command. It serves as the Army's Program Manager for Technical and Equipment publications, manages the Army Equipment Publications Program, and serves as the Electronic Technical Manual Program Configuration Manager and the Interactive Electronic Technical Manual Program Manager.

Mission Support Division manages and executes all financial and manpower resources; initiates and processes all personnel and hiring actions; develops and manages organizational plans, programs, and special projects; exercises management oversight for all contractual efforts; executes and manages the Freedom of Information Act program for the DoD Small Arms/Light Weapons Registry; executes the Property Management program; and provides information management, automation and communications support to the organization.
